## Introduction

1. What different reactions is the concept of "obedience" likely to get from people? Think about Christians and non-Christians.

## Thinking about Deuteronomy 30

2. Think about the structure of Deuteronomy (summarised below). Where does Chapter 30 fit into the whole book?

- 3. How does that help to explain what Moses is doing in this chapter?
- 4. Look over Deuteronomy 29. What does Moses expect will happen to Israel in the future? (How do you think he knows this?)
- 5. In light of chapter 29, what does Moses promise in 30:1-10? What will change for Israel? What does that suggest is their current problem?
- 6. What is the background to circumcision? (See Gen 17:9-14)
- 7. What is the connection between verse 6 and Lev 26:41 and Deut 10:16? How do they relate to Jer 4:4; 9:25, 26; Eze 44:7, 9; Ac 7:51.How do those passages relate to Jer 31:31-33; Rom 2:28-29; Heb 8:7-13.
- Go back to Deuteronomy 30. Moses tells Israel that the commands are "not too difficult", nor "beyond your reach" (Deut 30:11). How does that fit with the predicted (and actual) history of Israel? What is Moses point verses 11-14? How has that changed for Christians? (You could think about John 1:1-4, 14, 17; Eph 1:9-10; 3:2-6).

9. Imagine being in the crowd of the people of Israel listening to Moses final words (vv15-20). What might the conversation have been after he finished?

- 10. "Obedience is dry and dusty, love is life". How would Moses reply to a statement like that?
- 11. What are main points we can take from Deuteronomy 30 as we follow Jesus?
