Proverbs 1:1-7 Get Wisdom



Think about and discuss one or two questions from each section.

The text - Proverbs 1:1-7

- 1. Proverbs 1:1-7 is the Prologue to the book or perhaps more precisely to the first nine chapters of the book. As you read it, what is wisdom? What are the concerns of wisdom?
- 2. What does it mean to "fear" the LORD?
- 3. At the heart of the Prologue are the words of 1:3a "doing what is right and just and fair" or in the translation of the ESV "righteousness, justice, and equity". Discuss these three important words. What do they mean?

The Scriptures – Proverbs 1:1-7

- 4. The "fear of the LORD" is a phrase found throughout the wisdom writings. See for example, Job 1:1 and Ecclesiastes 12:13-14. Is that phrase used by New Testament authors? How do they speak about trusting/reverencing/fearing the LORD? See for example, 2 Corinthians 5:7-10, Philippians 2:12-13, or Hebrews 12:28-29.
- 5. Jesus tells a parable about being wise in Matthew 7:24-27. What is the difference between wisdom and foolishness according to Jesus?
- 6. The letter of James says a lot about wisdom. Read and discuss James 3:13-18. What does it mean to be wise according to James?

- 7. What are some areas in your life in which you need wisdom? Discuss some challenges or difficulties that you are facing currently?
- 8. How are you trusting the LORD in these situations? How can we support you in prayer and friendship?
