The text - Romans 5:12-21

- 1. How would you describe Adam and everyone he represents? What contrasts with Adam does Christ bring?
- 2. Come up with a sentence that describes the ways of God in this passage.
- 3. What do you understand by the phrase 'reigning in life' (5:17)?
- 4. Discuss the following statements:
 - Paul's argument implies that just as all humans die, now all humans will live
 - This passage does not make sense since we know there was no historical Adam
 - It's unfortunate the Paul reduces humanity to two men and ignores women

The Scriptures – Romans 5:12–21 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 5. How does Psalm 8 fill out our picture of Adam and Christ (and ourselves)?
- 6. How does the theme of royal authority unfold in the Bible? See Gen 1:28, Gen 17:16, Ex 19:6, 2 Sam 7:4–17, Jer 33:14–22, Rom 1:1–6, 1 Pet 2:9, Rev 20:6, Rev 22:5
- 7. Read over Rom 6–8 and notice how Paul continues to explore humanity in Adam and humanity in Christ.

- 8. Do you identify with Adam or Christ? How could your friends and family see that?
- 9. In the sermon, the idea that we reign with Christ was unpacked in these ways:
 - we have entered a new realm of an unshakeable kingdom
 - we are free, moment by moment, not to sin
 - we are restored to our Eden task of 'gardening' the earth
