Philippians 2:12-18 Work it out!



Think about and discuss one or two questions from each section.

The text – Philippians 2:12-18

- 1. Read Philippians 2:12-18. In 2:12-13, what is the relationship between our work and God's work?
- 2. What do you think it means to "work out your salvation with fear and trembling"?
- 3. Some arguments seem to be occurring within the church in Philippi (see 4:2-3). However, when Paul uses the words "grumbling" and "arguing" in 2:14 he is probably thinking more about grumbling against God. Why would Christians in Philippi be grumbling against, or arguing with God?
- 4. Notice the close relationship between sacrifice and gladness in 2:17-18. Discuss this perhaps unexpected relationship in Scripture between suffering and rejoicing; sacrifice and gladness.

The Scriptures – Philippians 2:12-18 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 5. Many of the words in 2:15 are borrowed from the preaching of Moses in Deuteronomy 32:4-6. Read and discuss the words of Moses. Why do you think Paul echoes them here?
- 6. Read and discuss Daniel 12:1-3. Paul is thinking about this passage when he tells the Philippian believers to shine like stars in the sky.
- 7. What does Paul mean by the "day of Christ" in 2:16? Read and discuss Philippians 3:20-21 in which he writes more about the day of Christ.

Our lives – walking the way of Jesus in response to Philippians 2:12-18 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 8. What are some areas in life in which we are tempted to grumble and argue with God? Or perhaps to grumble and argue with one another?
- 9. What are you working out at present? Are there any areas of life in which you are experiencing "fear and trembling"? How can we prayerfully support you in your discipleship?
