## Romans 8: 18-25 Working and waiting in a groaning world



Think about and discuss one or two questions from each section.

## The text - Romans 8:18-25

- 1. Read Romans 8:18-25. Paul has written about "sufferings" and "glory" in Romans 8:17. Connect this passage (8:18-25) with Paul's words in 8:17. Why does he now write about the creation in quite some detail?
- 2. What is the future of the creation in 8:19-22?
- 3. What is the future of the children of God in 8:23-25?
- 4. "Hope" is one of the most important words in the passage. What is the content of our hope?

## The Scriptures – Romans 8:18-25 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 5. The creation has been subjected to "frustration" or "futility". This is an important word that echoes much of the teaching in the book of Ecclesiastes. Read and discuss Ecclesiastes 1:1-11. What is so frustrating to the ancient teacher in this passage of Scripture?
- 6. Old Testament prophets envisaged a glorious future for the world. Read and enjoy the words of Isaiah 11:1-9.
- 7. There are many Scriptures about "first fruits". See for example, Exodus 23:19. What are the first fruits to which Paul refers in this passage (8:23). What fruits are yet to come?

## Our lives – walking the way of Jesus in response to Romans 8:18-25 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 8. Paul uses four images for the age in which we live: frustrated, enslaved, waiting, groaning in child-birth. Do you find these helpful? Is this how you think about the world?
- 9. How are you at waiting? Hoping? Persevering? How can we encourage and support you?
