The Text - Rom 8:26-30

- 1. What makes you groan? How is a groan both positive and negative? Who or what is groaning in Rom 8:18–25? Are you surprised that God's Spirit groans (8:26)?
- 2. Read Rom 8:26–27. On the back of this sheet, *draw a picture* of the relationship between the Spirit, the One who searches hearts and minds (perhaps God the Father), our weakness, our hearts, the Spirit's mind. What seems important to you?
- 3. If the Spirit prays in accordance with the will of God, what might be the content of these prayers?
- 4. Put Rom 8:28 in your own words. Can you tell a story from your own life to illustrate this?
- 5. Read Rom 8:29–30. Draw another picture on the back of this sheet, representing the plans God has for your life. What helps you to trust in these plans?
- 6. If you believed that God had the same plan for all Christians, how would this affect your relationships with Christian brothers and sisters?

- 7. What privileges come with living after the coming of the Spirit? See Joel 2:28–32
- 8. How does the story of Joseph (Gen 37–50) illustrate today's passage. Has there been a moment in your life when you could have said what Joseph says in Gen 50:20?
