The Text as a Portion of Scripture

- 5. What do these passages concerning idolatry share with Romans 1? Psalm 115:1–8; Isa 44:9–20.
- 6. What is the Bible's stance on homosexual behaviour in Gen 19:4–11; Lev 18:1–30; 1 Cor 6:9–11; 1 Tim 1:8–11.

The Text in our Lives

- 7. How has your life been affected by the vices listed in Rom 1:29–31? Have you experienced transformation or salvation? How?
- 8. What hope is there for people described in Rom 1:18-32?
- 9. Is Paul fair in his discussion of homosexual behaviour? Consider these arguments:
- Paul is opposed to acting against nature. A person who is same-sex attracted should behave according to that nature
- Paul is opposed to oppressive, exploitative sexual behaviour. Same-sex marriage is not what he is thinking about.
 - Paul is encouraging homophobia.
