The text - Luke 12:1-12

- 1. Read Luke 12:1-12. What is the context for these teachings of Jesus. Note the words of the previous chapter and particularly Luke 11:53-54.
- 2. Why, in 12:1-3, does Jesus teach his followers that they should be on guard against hypocritical words?
- 3. Why should God be feared? Why should God *not* be feared? Both are true in the teaching of Jesus in 12:4-7?
- 4. Jesus has court scenes in mind in 12:8-12, both in heaven and on earth. What does he teach about speaking when one is on trial?
- 5. What does it mean to "blaspheme the Holy Spirit"? Why is this unforgiveable?

The Scriptures - Luke 12:1-12 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 6. Jesus also speaks about blaspheming the Holy Spirit in Matthew and Mark. Read Matthew 12:22-28 and discuss what it means in this context.
- 7. What does "Son of Man", the name Jesus most often uses for himself, mean? One important passage in the Old Testament in understanding its meaning it Daniel 7:9-14. Read and discuss this passage.
- 8. In Acts 7:54-60 we read of the killing of Stephen. How do Jesus' words in Luke 12 relate to this event?

- 9. What sort of pressure are you under currently? What is a difficult context in which you need to speak true words and acknowledge Jesus faithfully?
- 10. How can we pray and support you in the way you speak and act as a disciple of Jesus?
