Luke 16: 1-15 Wealth for welcoming



Think about and discuss one or two questions from each section.

The text - Luke 16:1-15

- 1. Read the story of the rich master and the dishonest, shrewd manager in 16:1-8a. What happens in this story? Tell the story to one another.
- 2. In 16:8b-9, Jesus draws a conclusion from the story. What is the main point that he makes? How does he want the disciples to behave in the light of this story?
- 3. The word translated "welcome" (16:4 and 9) and "take" (16:6 and 7) is important. Discuss the uses of this word in the parable.
- 4. Discuss the teachings of Jesus in 16:10-15. What challenges does Jesus put before the disciples?

The Scriptures – Luke 16:1-15 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 5. Throughout the book of Luke there are many times on which Jesus condemns the wealthy. Read as one example, Luke 1:52-53 and Luke 12:32-24. What is Jesus teaching against?
- 6. 1 Timothy 6:6-10 is one of the most striking texts about money and wealth in NT Scripture. Read and discuss this important text.
- 7. In OT Scripture, wealth is most often portrayed as a sign of God's blessing. But not always. Read and discuss words condemning the actions of the rich in Jeremiah 5:26-29. To what is God opposed?

- 8. We are rich people in comparison with many throughout the world. What temptations do we face in terms of money and wealth?
- 9. How do you practice cheerful, generous living? What are some practices you have found helpful?
