Acts 20:17-38



The text - Acts 20:17-38

- 1. Read Acts 20:17-38. Paul talks with an intimate and personal tone through this passage with the frequent use of you, your, yourself and we. Why does he do this?
- 2. In Verse 19 Paul talks about 'serving the Lord with great humility and with tears'. Does this surprise you? Why or why not?
- 3. In Verse 20 Paul mentions 'preaching' and 'teaching'. What are the differences between these? List the various ways these ways can be applied in 'public' and from 'house to house'.
- 4. Verse 21 mentions the Jews and the Gentiles? What is the distinction? Why identify the two groups?
- 5. In Verse 21 Paul uses the imperative 'must'. Why?
- 6. In Verses 22-24 Paul talks about being compelled and warned by the Holy Spirit. Why is Paul responding with seemingly little regard for his safety?
- 7. In Verse 24, what does Paul mean by 'testifying to the good news of God's grace'?
- 8. In Verses 25-31, Paul appeals for Unity. How is the communal church focus made apparent by Paul in this section?
- 9. In Verse 35 Paul again uses the imperative 'must'. Why is Paul so insistent about helping the weak? Who are 'the weak'?
- 10. Which of Paul's words mean the most to you? Why?

The Scriptures – Acts 20:17-38 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 11. Read Acts 19 through to 20:16 to get a wider view of Paul's time in Ephesus. Why start with the Jews? What is the urgency to get to Jerusalem?
- 12. Read John Chapter 17, what are the similar themes in this prayer of Jesus to Pauls speech in Acts 20:17-38. List them.
- 13. What does Paul mean by 'word of his grace' giving them an 'inheritance' (Acts 20:32)? Is this salvation or rewards? (compare Colossians 3:22-25; 1 Corinthians 3:8; 1 Peter 3:8-9; 1 Peter 5:4)
- 14. What did Paul say regarding finances and his motivation to serve? What attitudes toward finances should people have (1 Timothy 3:3; 1 Peter 5:2)? Why is this important for leaders (1 Timothy 6:9-10)?

- 15. Have you turned to God in repentance and have put your faith in our Lord Jesus?
- 16. What does daily repentance look like to you?
- 17. How do you keep watch over yourself?

- 19. What should be one of a believer's financial goals? Why is it more blessed to give than to receive? Ask the Lord to show you some way that you can learn more about the joy of giving.
