Revelation 16:1-21



The text - Revelation 16:1-21

- 1. Read Revelation 16:1-21. This chapter envisions what was introduced in Revelation 15:1 the pouring out of the seven bowls of God's wrath. Summarise the visions of this chapter. How does it impact you as you read?
- 2. How are the bowls of wrath an expression of God's justice? Read and discuss Revelation 16:5-7.
- 3. Discuss the repeated refrain of Revelation 16:9, 11 and 21 "they refused to repent" and "they cursed God". What does this indicate about sin? Judgement? Salvation?
- 4. Revelation 16:15 is an important word, in the midst of the visions, to the church. What is the main point? How are God's people to live in the light of impending judgement?

The Scriptures – Revelation 16:1-21 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 5. The seventh bowl brings us to the final judgement of all things. Compare and contrast the vision of Revelation 16:18-21 with that of Revelation 11:19, a previous vision of the final judgement.
- 6. Read, compare and contrast Exodus 10:21-23 (the ninth plague on Egypt) with Revelation 16:10-11 (the fifth bowl).
- 7. Jesus also spoke about the thief in the night. Read Luke 12:35-40. Jesus is speaking to his disciples. What is his main point? Compare his teaching with the text in Revelation 16:15.
- 8. The apostle Paul also writes about the coming of the LORD in 1 Thessalonians 4:15-18. Read and discuss this important passage of Scripture.

- 9. How do you respond to Revelation 16 with its visions of God's anger?
- 10. What is the difference between justice and vengeance? How is God's anger just and righteous?
- 11. How does this passage of Scriptures impact your discipleship? What will you do in response?
- 12. How can we pray for you and support you as a result of this study of God's word?
