The text – Romans 2:12-29

- 1. Read Romans 2:12-16. What does Paul mean by "the law"?
- 2. What is "sin"? What is the relationship between sin and the law?
- 3. In Romans 2:12-16, Paul has the day of final judgement in mind (see 2:16). What will happen on that day?
- 4. Why is God's name blasphemed or dishonoured among the nations? Read and discuss 2:17-24.
- 5. Circumcision was an outward sign of God's covenant with Israel. What was the inward or heart reality it was meant to signify? Look particularly at what Paul says in 2:28-29.

The Scriptures – Romans 2:12-29 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 6. How does Jesus summarise the content and intent of the law in Matthew 22:34-40?
- Can sinful human beings actually fully obey the law? Look at Paul's conclusion in Romans 3:19-20.
- 8. Old Testament prophets wrote of a future time when God would send the Spirit to renew people's hearts. Read Ezekiel 36:24-28. How is this prophecy fulfilled by Jesus?

- 9. In Romans, Paul teaches that we can only really know ourselves by living in right relationships with God and one another. What are the biggest threats we face in this regard today?
- 10. What do you need to do to be deeply known by others? To develop deep relationships?
