## Luke 18: 31-43



## The Text - Luke 18:31-43

- 1. Read Luke 18:31-34. Why do you think the disciples were confused by Jesus words? What do you think it means that Jesus' meaning was *hidden* from them?
- 2. Read Luke 24:13-21. What does this suggest as the possible reason why the disciples didn't understand Jesus' words?
- 3. Read Luke 18:35-43. What do you think is the significance of the blind man calling Jesus Son of David? How does this contrast with what the followers of Jesus call him?
- 4. Skim back over Luke 18:1-30. What parallels do you see between these parables and the story of the blind man? What do you think is the significance of this?
- 5. How does the blind man respond after he is healed? How do Jesus' other followers respond to him?
- 6. What contrast do you think is being made between Jesus' disciples and the blind man? What do you think Jesus was trying to show his disciples?

## The Scriptures – Luke 18:31-43 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 7. Read Isaiah 29:13-19. In what ways were the disciples and Jesus' followers like the clay in this passage? How does Jesus fulfil verses 17-19 in this story?
- 8. Read the account of this healing in Mark 10:46-52. What differences do you notice in these accounts? What do you think these differences suggest about the intention of the two authors?

## Our lives – walking the way of Jesus in response to Luke 18:31-43 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 9. What do people in our society expect God to be like and to do? What false expectations do we sometimes place on God?
- 10. How do these expectations create blindfolds to seeing God's kingdom?
- 11. Jesus uses a nameless, blind man to show people a glimpse of God's kingdom. Where might God be using things our world has rejected to show us his kingdom?
