Ephesians 3:1-21



The text - Ephesians 3: 1-21

- 1. Read Ephesians 3:1-21. Notice the words "for this reason" in 3:1, again in 3:14, and previously in 1:15. What reason? What is "the reason" to which Paul keeps returning?
- 2. Discuss the words, "I, Paul, the prisoner of Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles". It is this set of relationships that causes Paul to write the words of 3:2-13, before praying. What stands out to you as you think about "Paul", "Jesus Christ", and "you Gentiles"?
- 3. In 3:2-6, Paul uses the word "mystery" on three occasions. What is this mystery? The word is used again in 3:9. What is this mystery that is now revealed?
- 4. In 3:7-13 Paul is conscious of his unworthiness, of God's grace, and of his suffering. Discuss the words of 3:8 "I am less than the least of all the Lord's people". Why is this the case?
- 5. Paul has already written about the "rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms" in 1:20-21. He will write about them again in 6:12. Who or what are these rulers and authorities?
- 6. What is the relationship between the triumph of God in 3:10-12 and the suffering of Paul in 3:13? Discuss the relationship between "freedom", "confidence" and being "discouraged" in these verses.
- 7. In what way does every family in heaven and earth derive its name from God the Father?
- 8. Notice Paul's use of the word for "power" in his prayer. What does he mean by power? What is power like? What does power do?
- 9. In Ephesians 3:19, "you" is plural that is, "that you (all together) may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God". How is the church filled in this way?

The Scriptures - Ephesians 3: 1-21 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 10. It had always been God's plan to bless people throughout the nations of the world as well as in Israel. Read the words of Isaiah 49:5-7 and discuss their relationship to Paul's words in Ephesians.
- 11. Paul also writes about God's revealed "mystery" in Colossians 1:24-29. Discuss this passage, comparing and contrasting it with the Ephesians passage.

- 12. Take time now to pray Paul's prayer in 3:15-21 for one another. Make it your prayer for yourself and for the members of the church in coming weeks.
- 13. What has encouraged you from this study in God's word?
- 14. What will you do as a result of God's word to you in Ephesians 3:1-21?
