The Text - James 2:14-26

- 1. Read James 2:14-26. Are there any verses you find confusing or uncomfortable? Why?
- 2. What point do you think James is trying to make about faith in verses 14-17? What words would you use to describe someone who lives this way?
- 3. What kinds of things is James thinking of when he speaks of works and deeds?
- 4. What do you think James means when he says "faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."
- 5. Does James think you can separate faith and deeds? Can they exist independently of each other?
- 6. What is the relationship between faith and works in the example of Abraham and Rahab?
- 7. What do you think James means when he says, "As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead?"
- 8. In your own words, describe how James would define faith according to this passage.

The Scriptures – James 1:12-18 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 9. Read Mark 12:30-31. How do James' words reflect these words of Jesus?
- 10. Read Romans 4:1-12. In Romans, Paul uses Abraham as an example to show we are saved by faith and **not** by works. How might James' and Paul's words both be true?

- 11.In what ways do we sometimes hold parts of ourselves back from God instead of giving ourselves as whole, living sacrifices?
- 12. How has your understanding of faith been challenged by this passage?
