## Revelation 19:11-20:15



## The text - Revelation 19:11-20:15

- 1. Read Revelation 19:11-20:15. This section of Revelation is shaped by the words "I saw" which are found eight times between 19:11 and 20:12. As you read, summarise what John saw.
- 2. Most often in Revelation, Jesus is portrayed as a Lamb that had been slain. However, in 19:11-16, he is portrayed as the rider on a white horse. What do you learn about the names of this rider?
- 3. What happens to the "kings, generals, and the mighty, horses and their riders, all people, free and slave, small and great" in the vision of 19:17-21?
- 4. Describe what the angel does to the devil in 20:1-3.
- 5. Do you understand a 1,000 years to be a literal period of time, or a symbolic number signifying completeness, a full time, the time of God's choosing?
- 6. Who is ruling the world in 20:4-6?
- 7. What is the final destiny of the devil in 20:7-10?
- 8. Revelation 20:11-15 envisions the final judgement. How many books are there? What is the difference between the books?

## The Scriptures - Revelation 19:11-20:15

- 9. Psalm 2:7-12. What similarities do you see between this portion of Psalm 2 and Revelation 19:15-16?
- 10. Many of the images in Revelation 19:17-21 come from Ezekiel 39:1-6. Read this passage from Ezekiel and discuss it briefly.
- 11. Read the words of Jesus in John 12:31-33. What similarities do you note between these words and the description of what happens to Satan in Revelation 20:1-3?
- 12. Paul writes about God restraining evil and lawlessness in 2 Thessalonians 2:5-12. Read this passage and discuss it in the light of what you have read in Revelation 20:1-3.
- 13. Ezekiel prophesies about Gog and Magog in Ezekiel 38:1-6 and following. Read the opening verses of Ezekiel 38. Who do you understand Gog and Magog to be?

- 14. How does the reality of God's judgement impact your life?
- 15. How has this study in Revelation challenged you? What will you do as a result?
- 16. Read the words of Jude 24-25 as you finish this study and discussion. Make them the basis for prayer in the week to come.
