## The Text – 1 Kings 1-11

- 1. Read 1 Kings 8:54-61. What do you think of Solomon's speech? What does this suggest about Solomon's heart?
- 2. Read 1 Kings 10:14-29. What do you make of this description of Solomon? What does this suggest about Solomon's heart?
- 3. Read 1 Kings 9:1-9. What is the promise and warning of this passage? What is the connection between Solomon's character and the future of Israel?
- 4. Browse through some of the following passages: 1 Kings 1:38-40; 2:1-4; 3:5-9; 4:20-28; 6:1-2; 7:1-2; 8:54-61; 9:3-9; 10:14-22; 11:1-3. What hints do we get that Solomon's heart was divided?
- 5. Read Deuteronomy 17:14-20. How does this compare with Solomon's life?
- 6. Read 1 Kings 11:9-23. What are the consequences of Solomon's divided heart for himself? For Israel?

## The Scriptures – 1 Kings 1-11 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 1. Read Matthew 12:38-42. What do you think Jesus means when he says, "one greater than Solomon is here?" How does Solomon's reign anticipate Jesus?
- 2. Read John 10:22-30. What do we learn about Jesus' character and heart here? How does this contrast with Solomon?
- 3. Read Acts 2:5-12; 42-47. How does Jesus' kingship begin to shape this new kingdom of believers?

## Our lives – walking the way of Jesus in response to 1 Kings 1-11 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 1. What do you think the book of 1 Kings teaches about the typical pattern of rulers and leaders in our world?
- 2. With this in mind, what should our attitude be to rulers and leaders? How might we respond to disappointing or frustrating decisions?
- 3. What do you think it might look like for our church family to mirror the heart and character of our true king?
