James 4: 1-10



The Text - James 4:1-10

- 1. Read through James 4:1-10. In your own words, describe the problems James sees in the church. What does he see as the cause of this trouble?
- 2. What do you think it means that their 'passions are at war' within them? How does this cause fighting?
- 3. In verses 2 and 3, it describes prayer. What do these verses reveal about the hearts of the people fighting and their attitude towards God?
- 4. Verse 4 makes an accusation that these people have chosen friendship or 'the affection' of the world. How does this connect with the first 3 verses?
- 5. Verses 5 and 6 are difficult verses. What spirit are they talking about? What does it mean when it says, 'But he gives more grace?'
- 6. Verses 7-10 describe the response James is urging the warring church to take. What surprises or confronts you about his words? Why would this response of mourning and weeping be appropriate?
- 7. From your discussion, try and summarise the main ideas of this passage in your own words. How would you summarise it simply for a friend?

The Scriptures – James 4:1-10 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 8. Read Proverbs 3:28-35. James quotes this passage in verse 6. How is this passage in Proverbs related to James' teaching?
- 9. Read Micah 2:1-3. What connections do you notice between this passage and James?
- 10. Read Matthew 6:19-24. In what ways does Jesus' teaching reflect the words of James?

Our lives – walking the way of Jesus in response to James 4:1-10 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 11. In what ways do humans try and take possession of the world? Where have you seen this create 'warring' and fighting?
- 12. How might your attitude to possessions and power and influence change if we see all these things as gifts from God for a time to be used in love for him?
- 13. Where does pride lurk in your life? How might you respond to these areas in light of this passage?
