Psalm 25



The text - Psalm 25

- 1. Read verses 1–7. What problems are facing the Psalmist? Why does he pray about these?
- 2. Read verses 8–10. What does the Psalmist believe about God? How does he know this?
- 3. What things can happen in the relationship between God and people? Pay particular attention to verses 11–15.
- 4. What do you think of verse 14 in the RSV? The friendship of the Lord is for those who fear him.
- 5. How does the picture of human need develop in verses 16–20?
- 6. In verse 21 whose integrity and uprightness is the Psalmist talking about? His or God's? What is the logic of this?
- 7. Does the Psalm have an idea that holds it all together? What about the idea of *trust*?

The Scriptures – Psalm 25 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 8. The Psalm is Of David. What do you notice if you read with David in mind?
- 9. How does the Psalm present the idea of covenant? What similarities and differences do you see when you read Psalm 25 and Psalm 89?
- 10. How is the relationship between God and the Psalmist like that of Jesus and his disciples in John 15:9–16?
- 11. It can be good to read the Psalms as though Jesus is praying them? Can you imagine Jesus praying Psalm 25?

Our lives – walking the way of Jesus in response to Ephesians 5:21-6:9 as a portion of the Scriptures

- 12. The Psalmist presents many challenges of being human: shame, enemies, sin and guilt, emotional distress, ignorance and uncertainty. Which of these are you experiencing at the moment? Why?
- 13. Can you see how this Psalm might shape what you could pray for?
- 14. How does the Psalmist feel about God? Does this match your current experience?
